Several concerns were voiced by committee members that at the time award submission were due three students had not renewed their memberships. This was resolved, however, the deadline for submissions and renewing memberships differ by approximately a month and may require policy to ensure that students are removed from the competition while they may be waiting for a paycheck to pay for their membership fees.

NCB-ESA meeting – Student Competition

- Judges = 33 judges; 61 10-minute talks across 7 sessions, 34 posters across 4 sessions.
- We used the same poster and 10-minute talk evaluation forms that were used last year and were used at the national meeting (accessible online on the meeting website).
- A Head Judge was designated and asked to fill out a consensus list of winners (First Place, second place and third place) in order to speed up the process of creating the presentation for the awards ceremony and writing checks.
- All judges will be given a judging packet (with judging guidelines, relevant abstracts, and evaluation forms).
- Having attendees indicate willingness to volunteer for judging at time of registering for meeting was a great help in getting enough judges. We have judges for all sessions and have plenty of back-up judges.
