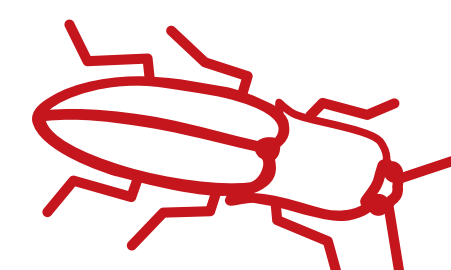

A MEETING

For a society or group to discuss finances, give awards, plan, etc.

Organized Meetings due MARCH 1

Submission Tips

Can include scientific content in the form of award presentations, keynote speakers, etc.

A SYMPOSIUM

A collection of presentations that share a theme

Will your symposium...

align and support the theme "Insects and Influence: Advancing Entomology's Impact on People and Policy"?

Program Symposia due MARCH 1

serve the interests of one of ESA's four sections (MUVE, PBT, P-IE, SysEB) by appealing to entomologists in those areas?

Section Symposia due MARCH 1

focus on a topic that is more narrowly defined than a section symposium and/or is of interest to members across sections?

Member Symposia due MARCH 1

Submission Tips

- Plan to invite a diversity of speakers from a variety of different career levels, institutions, and across various entomology societies.
- A submission with at least some committed speakers is stronger than one with none.
- If you submit a Program or Section Symposia and it is rejected from that category, it will automatically be considered for Member Symposia.
- Submission for sessions that will create a product (i.e., white paper, journal article, future collaborations/ meetings or proposal writing) are strongly encouraged.

A WORKSHOP

Several planned hands-on activities, possibly paired with presentation(s)

Will your workshop...

take longer than an hour, with significantly more hands-on engagement for participants?

Workshops due MARCH 1

be completed within an hour, often involving a short activity, panel, or guided discussion?

Mini-workshops due MAY 15

Submission Tips

- Workshops that focus on:
- creative art-based themes
 - diversity, equity, inclusion, and allyship
 - science communication, or
 - professional development (including scientific skills)
 - undergraduate and K-12 teaching are strongly encouraged.
- We encourage inviting a diversity of speakers, workshop leaders, etc.

A SOCIAL GATHERING
