
P-IE Governing Council Approves Policies and Procedures Document

Recent Activities of the ESA Liaison to the EPA Office of Pesticide Programs (OPP)

The EPA OPP is interested in presenting quarterly webinars about sundry insect/insecticide issues. They would like to invite an ESA member who has expertise about a particular subject to make the webinar presentation. EPA OPP would like the first webinar to be a discussion of tick and flea insecticide products. The news media have recently reported that hundreds of pet owners have complained about acute toxicity symptoms associated with use of the collar product Seresto (combination of imidacloprid and flumethrin; see USA Today report https://www.usatoday.com/story/news/investigations/2021/03/02/seresto-dog-cat-collars-found-harm-pets-humans-epa-records-show/4574753001/).

In other news, EPA has issued a draft registration decision approving use of a new product containing the active ingredients cyclaniliprole and flonicamid for residential outdoor use on ornamentals, including non-fruit bearing trees. These insecticides can target selectively phloem feeding insects. EPA is seeking comments on its draft decision and pointed out specific ecological risks of concern, including a pollinator advisory and ground and surface water advisories of potential hazards. Both of these insecticides fit into the umbrella of "reduced risk" insecticides owing to their high selectivity for phloem feeders and very low toxicity to non-target organisms, including humans.
