Science Policy Activity

The 2020 P-IE Science Policy Activity was postponed until 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

The postponed activity was selected on September 15, 2019. An event plan submitted by Dr. Lauren Diepenbrock (University of Florida) and Dr. Dave Coyle (Clemson University) was an "Invasive Species Tour", coordinated jointly with SysEB and focused on the following topics:

- ·Invasive pest management in natural areas and wood products
- ·Invasive pest management and ongoing challenges in citrus and avocado
- · Invasive species management in commercial citrus production
- Invasive fire ant control using non-chemical means
- · Invasive species interception/detection and quarantine at an international airport

A call for 2022 proposals was sent to members with a December 31, 2020 deadline.



ESA Annual Meeting Activities

Hot Topics

P-IE GC moved to transfer business reporting items from a slide presentation to their final newsletter for 2020. As the entirety of the ESA Annual Meeting was conducted virtually in 2020, the P-IE GC decided that members would not be interested in logging into a livestream or recorded presentation of typical business-meeting items during our Networking Session, However, the P-IE GC worked with ESA HQ to retain an Awards Celebration as part of our Virtual Awards Celebration as a livestream activity. Additionally, we continued to offer Hot Topics and Speed Networking programs as coordinated ESA Annual Meeting activities. Our Hot Topics involved 120-150 total participants for the following 6 topics:

- 1. Pollinators
- 2. Sustainable Pest Management
- 3. Biocontrol
- 4. Diversity and inclusion
- 5. Public outreach and education
- 6. Invasive species

These topics were derived from our 2020 member survey and will serve as an additional platform for further discussion and fine-tuning our future WIGs.

Speed Networking

A Speed Networking took place again this year through our Virtual ESA Annual Meeting. The event had a total of 48 participants (24 students/ECPs and 24 established member volunteers). The students/ECP had 1-on-1 five minute conversations with established members over the course of an hour. The established members represented either academia, industry, or government. Nominations For P-IE Committees

By January 31, 2021, the Governing Council (GC) needs P-IE members to nominate themselves to become members of the Awards and Nominations Committees. For the Nominations Committee we only need candidates who are members of the International Branch or the NC Branch of the ESA (2 positions). These terms end in December 2023. The Nominations Committee finds candidates for elected positions.

The P-IE GC needs 5 candidates for positions on the Awards Committee, which is active in June and July selecting winners of P-IE awards. We have doubled the size of the committee. We need 2 members who work in academia and 2 members who work in industry. One in each group will have a 1-year term; the other will have a 2-year term. We also need one member who works in a government agency. This is a 2-year term.

Due to substantial changes in the 2020 ESA Annual Meeting resulting from an on-line platform, we changed the format of our annual section meeting titled, "P-IE Networking and Awards Celebration". The program consisted of our regular awards ceremony (with virtual acceptance comments from award winners via livestreaming). Following the awards ceremony, summaries/proposals of our Hot Topics were presented.

Section Governing Council Capability Reporting

Reporting, per Section 5.2 of the ESA Bylaws:

Purpose. The purpose of the Sections is to develop and implement the key capabilities for their membership that result in: outreach related to science and public policy, program development, continuing education, and fostering interest in entomology.

Based on progress and assessments from 2019 concerning P-IE's WIGs, the P-IE GC felt it necessary to use 2020 to review and revise our WIGs. Therefore, we conducted a short survey that was active from February to August (which was made available to members through our monthly newsletters and on social media) asking the following two questions: 1) "What would you like to see P-IE membership achieve?" and 2) "How do you think P-IE membership could make this achievement a reality?". We received 78 responses or 3% of our total membership responding. The P-IE GC offered drawings and randomly selected winners from the participant pool to win 3 \$100 gift cards.

From this survey, we identified the following topics that received the most comments and interest from P-IE membership:

- 1. Pollinators
- 2. IPM
- 3. Biocontrol
- 4. Sustainability
- 5. Diversity and inclusion
- 6. Public outreach and education
- 7. Invasive species

These seven topic areas were then incorporated into focus areas for "Hot Topics" discussions held during the ESA Virtual Annual Meeting. Communications were sent to member leaders that expressed a strong interest in these areas and we will use the summary results of the Hot Topics discussion groups to guide our Wildly Important Goals in 2021.

Additionally, as evidence of growing, national impact, the USDA Office of the Chief Scientist invited representation from ESA P-IE to sit on their newly formed USDA Honey Bee and Pollinator Research Committee. This committee discussed priorities for setting research directions for USDA funding and were centered around the question, "Are the Farm Bill Subsections satisfied?". Several pre-recorded presentations were played and offered insights on the current status of pollinator health in the U.S. and the E.U., including factors contributing to honey bee colony losses, longitudinal studies on honey bee colonies, issues around sugar-doped honey entering the U.S. market, general pollinator status and trends, and several question and answer periods. While the presence of P-IE at this meeting was useful for the P-IE president to gain additional insight into issues facing pollinators (and the P-IE President did offer to have P-IE facilitate symposia or workshops to help facilitate researcher connections at either the ESA Annual Meeting or at next year's ICE meeting in Helsinki), it was not clear if there was something more that the USDA/EPA might expect from P-IE to facilitate national, research-directing priorities. As we move forward with our new WIGs in 2021 and should P-IE continue to be invited to this joint meeting, there may be opportunities to engage or connect a future "pollinator committee" to this national pollinator-priorities setting activity.
