Student Research Travel Award (SRTA) Applications for 2023 Now Being Accepted

The SRTA program is specifically designed to support SysEB undergraduate and graduate students by providing funding for research travel to other institutions and fieldwork. Additionally, SRTA funds can be used to attend our 2023 Annual Meeting in National Harbor, MD. The ultimate goal of the program is to enhance research projects and support the scientific study of biodiversity. Awards typically range between \$1,000-\$1,500 and are available to current undergraduate or graduate students who are members of the SysEB Section. The Council welcomes applications from highly motivated and talented students who have a passion for the scientific study of biodiversity. If you are

The J. E. and Jean M. McPherson Entomology Undergraduate and Graduate Student Biodiversity Awards are now open for applications to SysEB undergraduate and graduate students. These awards support research in biodiversity, with emphasis on non-taxonomic studies such as natural history, behavior, conservation, and more. Eligible expenses include travel, lodging, food, equipment, materials, and related costs. The award amounts typically range from \$1,000 to \$2,000.
