- 1. <u>Call to Order</u> -- The meeting was called to order at 1:05 p.m. by President Rob Wiedenmann, who welcomed participants. The agenda was reviewed and left unchanged.
- 2. <u>Journal Program Strategic Review</u> Joseph Esposito reviewed current progress on the strategic review of the Society's publishing program. Esposito gave a general overview of the options for improving the reach and financial performance of ESA's publication program. Recommendations will be made as part of a final report to be presented at the

November Governing Board meeting. The Governing Board discussed the work and the current publishing environment of the journals.

- 3. <u>July Minutes</u> The July 2013 minutes of the Governing Board were unanimously approved with a few minor corrections.
- 4. <u>Financial Reserve Policy</u> Gammel presented a proposed financial reserve policy. The proposed policy identified a minimum financial reserve below which the Society will not allow the reserves to go. The Governing Board discussed the appropriate level.

Motion: To set the minimum financial reserve level at 85% of the current year budget with the remainder being in the strategic reserve.

Motion carries: Yes - 9; No - 3; Absent-4

- 5. <u>Annual Meeting Update</u> Director of Meetings Rosina Romano shared that close to 2000 people have registered for Entomology 2013 as of today. The early bird deadline is set for September 23rd. Sponsorships for the annual meeting are at 200% of their target revenue.
- 6. <u>Science Policy Updates</u> Executive Director David Gammel provided updates on the following science policy activities and issues:
 - a. **August District Visits -** The visits were promoted and organized through the American Institute of Biological Science and over 30 entomologists registered to participate. Vice President Elect Phil Mulder shared his experience meeting with a science advisor for Congressman Bridenstine. Mulder and the advisor had a good discussion for about 45 minutes and were able to cover several of the points provided by ESA.
 - b. Science Policy Fellowship Program A proposal for the program will be officially submitted during the November meeting. The intent is to create a mix of online and in person events for early professionals so they can learn how science policy and funding is developed at the Federal level. Wiedenmann and Vice President Frank Zalom both commented on the value for the Society in developing the potential participants. Both also noted that they will be able to make valuable contributions to overall science policy efforts.
 - c. **Issues on the Hill** Gammel discussed meetings conducted with legislative staff about tick-borne diseases and invasive species. Wiedenmann and Zalom, who attended the meetings, discussed how much opportunity there is to share critical information to policy makers and that ESA has the potential for substantial impact and influence if we increase our federal outreach.
 - d. **Pending OA Legislation in Congress –** Congressman Sensenbrenner's office is currently working on drafting legislation. CSSP's Executive Committee discussed publisher issues with Sensenbrenner's office.
- 7. <u>Adjourn</u> There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:08pm.
